

A grade weakness on low float runner

1st day play/ 2nd day play:

-usually A grade weaknesses are on first day runners usually not SSR names, but could also be

Tight spreads:

-most A grade weaknesses will have extremely tight spreads once the price starts to press into support one last time before the wash.
-if price presses into support but ask is way above price it usually indicates not enough sell pressure or bid buying, so wait until bid and ask come close

Number of highs / lows:

-A grade structure should have 3 highs / lows in it, 2 is B quality and anything over 3 is usually more rare

Covering / TPing:

-cover some into quick wash but leave at least half size still going, since in most cases it will still drop more

Front / back side:

-most A grade plays are usually on back side where price is constantly micro washing, however they are also present on strong front side but with much stronger bull legs, if price stalls on trendline its ok to go if you hold for larger target and cut quickly if it bounces

Market presence:

-this play is present especially in low float runners but also in higher cap SSR stocks with heavy bear moves

LH progression:

-A grade play has progressively lower highs each high being significantly weaker

High edge play:

-one of the plays with highest win and reliability rate, especially when on clear backside, very important!

Micro washes:

-All A grade weaknesses have micro washes in every bear leg, VERY important!
